

Our club growth team has two major areas of focus: **build new clubs and support existing clubs to achieve excellence**. Our team is so amazing! They have been working relentlessly to serve our members, our clubs, and our leaders. What I love most is the passion and dedication working in the vibration of their excellence. Here are the highlights:

- I need to commend the Community Outreach team lead by Choon Mah-Megett who consistently gathers District leaders and volunteers to coordinate street fairs, farmer's markets, and special events. With each monthly event, we are moving closer towards our district goals.
- I am proud to acknowledge our entire New Clubs team lead by Karen Persip, DTM, Club Extension Chair, and all of our six Assistant Division Directors for Club Growth in each Division, and our Sponsor/Mentor Chair, Rodger Cota, DTM, PDG. They are not only helping to build clubs, they are also filling in the gaps to ensure that new clubs are mentored in excellence to build strong foundations by providing incredible, fun, educational workshops every two months. As a result, in the next four weeks we have 7 scheduled demonstration meetings throughout the district. Six out of the seven of these new club demos will be in corporations. If you have time to help us, we may be able to add you to our current demonstration team. Better yet, volunteer to become one of these new clubs' Mentors and make a difference in the lives of others.
- We have a dedicated Club Coach Chair, Larry Lee, DTM. He not only conducts "Cheerful Chatter" among all of his Club Coach bimonthly training workshops, he is also strategically placing trained Coaches throughout the district to clubs that are in a vulnerable, lower-than-normal membership dilemma. We are blessed with a passionate Speechcraft Chair, Janet Cormier, DTM. She is consistently training and beginning Speechcraft sessions in clubs that are challenged with low membership. As a result, both Chairs are spearheading our clubs to fulfill our mission; to support each club to achieve excellence.
- For our second membership-building contest, we have created and printed thousands of "Join Us" business cards for each officer trained at TLI. Our Club Retention Chair, Dolores Corpus, DTM, has compiled 500 plastic binders with thousands of business cards. These cards begin our Talk-up-Toastmasters contest to add 5 new members between February 1 and March 31st. Those clubs that reached the Smedley, Talk-up-Toastmasters, and Beat the Clock will win an additional \$50 Toastmasters International gift certificate.

We have so many other team members that are quietly monitoring and adding value to our district membership growth. They are creating statistical data for our team or setting up Meetup sites for clubs. For example, our Holiday Cheer Chair, Sherry Wray, ACS, CL, spearheaded Holiday Gift of Membership campaign ending in January; and Athene Puppos, DTM, Open House Chair, is tracking all the January open houses resulting in 3 or more new members so members and clubs can be recognized.

As a result, everyone on our team is contributing to make their home clubs strong and making valuable team contributions so we can plan well and make sound strategic decisions for our District. I am one proud mama watching our team shine.

Member Spotlight: Interview with Hannah Cowherd, President of Speak Up @ Anderson

DR: Tell us about Speak Up @ Anderson.

HC: I have to first and foremost thank you, Donna Robinson, for bringing Toastmasters to UCLA Anderson School. Donna, you are dedicated to making sure a project is completed. Anyone who is blessed to have had the privilege to work with you knows just how dedicated you are. On several occasions, I've had the opportunity to see your projects blossom into successful events, programs, and reports. It's kinda fun to see a visionary at work. Donna, you had the vison to bring Toastmasters to Anderson and you did it. Thank you for being that visionary person in my life.

Rob Weiler, Associate Dean and Elena Marentes, Director of Human Resources, thank you for allowing UCLA Anderson to host our meetings at Anderson. Your support has helped make Speak Up @ Anderson successful. Our club allows staff at UCLA to be in a safe environment where they can practice their public speaking skills. We offer a great location and have two of the best Toastmasters mentors any club can have. Our mentors are Lola Love and Jon White. Our club meet twice a month (every 1st and 3rd Fridays of the month).

DC: What you think makes the club unique?

HC: We function well as a "baby club." With the guidance of our mentors and training and leadership from our

Area Director, we have reached our goals to make our club a President's Distinguished club. All of this we did within our first year of being chartered.

Our club is comprised of staff members all over UCLA campus. We share so many different backgrounds and experiences with each other. Our diverse group makes our speeches interesting, sometimes educational, and many times comical. We take each speech as a learning tool. We remember what each evaluator says about our speeches and try to make that mental note to improve our next speech. We truly learn from each other.

DC: What have been some of your learning lessons with a new club?

HC: Being the President of a new club is a huge responsibility and learning experience. Because we are a new club we are prone to make a few mistakes. With each mistake is a lesson learned. Mistakes can only make us stronger and open to understanding what we can do better as a club. For example, during the summer many of our members were on vacation. I wanted to cancel a meeting because I did not have enough people volunteer to take a functionary role, but I kept the meeting. During it I called on individuals to take on roles. At first I was apprehensive in asking, but I explained how taking on a functionary role will put you one step closer to completing your CL & CC goals. From now on I will do just that; call on people during the meeting if we don't have enough sign-ups in advance.

I have learned that it takes patience and dedication to keep a club going. If a Board Member can no longer fulfill their obligation, the club should not stop running. I just picked up the responsibility and will keep it rolling until we have our next election. That was a huge lesson on my part to never give up.

DC: What do you think has made your club so successful?

HC: Speak Up @ Anderson has dedicated members who want to see our club succeed. We are fortunate to have great Toastmasters mentors who constantly gives us encouragement and advice during our meetings. We also have some dynamic creative minds on our Executive Board. Jessica McGruder volunteered to create a newsletter and did it! Angela Horne volunteered to create our website and is working on that project as we speak. Ramona Griffin has volunteered to be the chair of our raffle-based fundraising project. We are looking forward to having an even better year in 2017.

DC: Why did you join Toastmasters and how has it helped you in your current role of President?

HC: I joined Toastmasters because you asked me to join. But really, I joined because I was curious to see what it was all about. I wanted to know exactly how they (Toastmasters) would make me a better public speaker. I had a deep fear of public speaking because whenever I spoke in a small group or in front of a larger audience I would foresee myself standing or sitting frozen without having anything to say. That was a thought I always had and I wanted that to go away.

So far, I can say that I don't have that fear anymore. Just being in Toastmasters has made me automatically count the number of filler words (ums, likes, you knows...) I hear in my own conversations and in other speeches I hear on campus and in the media. It's kind of funny that whenever we have a general assembly staff meeting or a town hall meeting, I start to count the number of ums and ahs in the speeches. Then after the meeting my fellow Toastmasters glance at each other and smile because we know that we've all been counting the ums and ahs.

My hope is to have Speak Up @ Anderson participate in several competitions and gain more active members. I am confident that we will have a stronger club this coming year.
