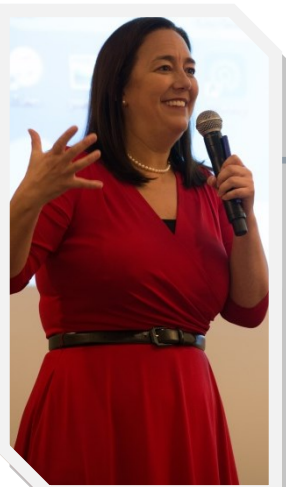
District One 2016 Fall Conference

Club Spotlight: Raising the Bar Toastmasters

Full Disclosure: When I was Division C Governor, Raising the Bar was one of my favorite clubs to visit. The club meets every Thursday evening at a large, private room at IHOP in Compton. While this is a traditional community club, Raising the Bar has a unique aura. Every time I attended, the members were warm and welcoming, and every speaker moved me. Speeches were personal and inspirational and I left each meeting with a new perspective. The quality of this supportive and nurturing environment was seen in 2015 when member Ivory Cooper represented District One at the World Championship of Public Speaking.

Jacquelyn Deloatch also has a soft spot for this club. A former Division C Governor, Jacquelyn was a Club Sponsor for Raising the Bar in 2011, helping to establish the fourth Toastmasters club in Compton. She says that this is “an awesome club because they believe in Toastmasters values. When you follow the 90 year example of Ralph Smedley—structure, discipline and order—you will grow.”

A 3-year veteran of the club, C-4 Area Director Tanei Varner, CC, CL, currently serves as Raising the Bar’s VPE. Ask what’s special about her club and Tanei lights up: “Its members. The energy. The people!” She loves the positive, uplifting atmosphere. “You learn a lot about the members,” she continues. “Members are diverse in terms of their careers and their personal stories. You can learn a lot.”

Club President Jerry James, CC and one speech away from his ACB, came to Raising the Bar two years ago. Initially he began his Toastmasters program with another local club; his second year was spent missing a lot of meetings due to work-related travel; and then he finally found Raising the Bar. The club is a perfect fit for Jerry, who is a minister. He wanted to be the best public speaker he could be for his congregation and the positive, motivational quality of this club helps him reach his potential.

Jerry has specific goals to further the club: to keep the energy high at every meeting and to live up to the club’s name. “I want to be the type of leader that when someone comes into our meeting, they don’t know I’m the president. I want us all to shine.” Jerry’s leadership, too, shines. The club is growing and the meetings are always enriching. And like Tanei, Jerry points to the club’s energy as unique and special. “The energy is always optimistic,” says Jerry. “Doesn’t matter how many people attend the meeting. The energy is so enticing, so welcoming—it causes you to do the best you can.”
